

TRAVEL: Kingston is served by Canadian National trains from Toronto (Union Station and Guildwood), Montreal (Central Station and Dorval, close to Montreal Dorval Airport), and Ottawa. The travel time is approximately 3 hours from each city.

Bus service at more frequent intervals is available by Voyageur Colonial from Toronto (at 610 Bay Street), Montreal (at 505 East Maisonneuve), and Ottawa (265 Catherine Street).

ACCOMMODATIONS: Space has been reserved in Victoria Hall, one of the University Residences, which is across the road from Stirling Hall where the Annual Meeting will be held and a three-minute walk from the Dining Room in Ban Righ. Accommodation in single or double rooms is available. 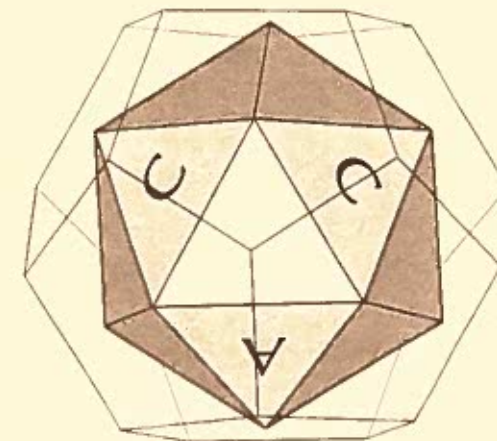
